B'yachad Services (the Hebrew word for Together) Everyone is welcome. The Main Sanctuary will only be for those who are fully vaccinated and those who can show proof of immunity. At this time, **masks are required.** Those who are unvaccinated or not fully vaccinated will be seated in a separate space, able to enjoy the service on a large screen, masks required and distancing recommended.

Collage & Children's Services A fully masked service, everyone is welcome and is required to be masked and distancing is recommended. This is to accommodate children under 12 years of age.
